Rolling River Rampage VBS


July 15-18 | 5:30p to 8p



Your contributions toward our Lighting project have been great! Your support has allowed us to look at a larger LED replacement package to possibly include the Educational Building, Christian Fellowship Center and Church Offices. While we have had a great first response to our initial plea for funding to resolve major lighting issues in the sanctuary as well as modernizing other areas of the church, we have hundreds of lights to potentially be replaced and upgraded to LED. By the first of June we expect to receive much needed technical information regarding the lighting in the Sanctuary to ensure that we have selected the right fixtures to ensure we have adequate lighting coverage (and no shadows). Myers Music Camp | Fire Drill | July 30-August 3



15 Foods to avoid if you have Heartburn

I have heartburn, medically referred to as gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD) or dyspepsia. Let me share with you the 15 foods that stimulate heartburn...all of which I like! So, unfortunately all the good things to eat increase heartburn, but by trying to minimize some of these foods, you can reduce your severity or incidence of GERD.

- 1. Fried Foods -These oily foods stay in the stomach longer and more acid due to the oils, & increase reflux
- 2. Alcohol relaxes the esophageal sphincter & increase reflux, especially beer & red wine. Try to minimize size of meals if you enjoy a drink with your meals to decrease risk of heartburn.
- 3. Spicy foods increase acid levels in stomach & therefore dyspepsia.
- 4. Tomatoes due to very high acid content of tomatoes, including ketchup & salsa, etc.
- 5. Oranges again same as tomatoes...very high in citric acid. Try alkaline fruits such as berries, apples, pears, bananas, & melons.
- 6. Mint often used to settle the stomach it also relaxes the sphincter & hence increases heartburn. Try ginger tea especially before bedtime if you suffer from heartburn.

- 7. Beef again it is the fatty content of the beef that increase time in stomach & acid to digest & therefore increased heartburn. Leaner cuts are better if you have GERD.
- 8. Coffee high in acid & relaxes the sphincter...double whammy.
- 9. Cheese high in acid & fats. Consider lower fat cheeses such as cottage cheese, ricotta, & any other low fat cheeses. Cheese sauces can be particularly bad, as they typically also include lots of heavy cream & butter.
- 10. Soda not only are sodas high in acid but the carbonation forces acid up through the sphincter to irritate the esophagus.
- 11. Chocolate high in fat, caffeine which relaxes the sphincter & is slow to digest.
- 12. Garlic & Onions triggers heartburn for many people. If you notice the association, consider other spices to flavor your food.
- 13. Salt & pepper many people don't consider these spices but they are & create increased acid in stomach. (see number 3 above).
- 14. Butter again high fat increases GERD.
- 15. Candy high simple sugar content is highly associated with GERD, especially if is with a sour candy with lots of vitamin C or citric acid.


