M yers Health Cabinet

The Health Cabinet wanted to take a moment with our monthly health news to make our congregation aware of The Little Red Schoolhouse Fund, who can benefit and how to get the monies to the individuals in need.

The Fund came to being from one of our Myers saints, Mr. Harry Mims and his Sunday School class (The Builders Class) in the early 1980s. While on a business trip to New York City, Harry was eating a delicious meal in an exclusive restaurant. He was thinking of the many children back in Gaston County that would no longer have lunch every day due to the fact that the US government had recently stopped the funding for several important social programs. When he returned, he challenged his Sunday school class to save their loose pocket change, donate it each Sunday and then later distribute it to each school in the county for students who had no lunch money. They continued for about two years and then the state reinstated the former lunch program.

Harry and his Sunday school class then decided to change the focus of their endeavors.

Having worked with school nurses and social workers for many years, Harry was keenly aware of the need in many families in Gaston County who could not afford health insurance. A class member, Raymond Wallace, built a small red schoolhouse, which was used to collect the offering for the children each Sunday morning. (and still sits at Myers today in the Parlor) As word of the project spread, contributions came from many other sources and the fund grew, and continues to today, along with help from a large endowment. Mr. Max Erwin is now the one from the Builders class who has taken the banner and been the champion for the Little Red Schoolhouse Fund for many years.

Today the primary goal of the Fund is to provide monies for health care to Gaston County school children that is unavailable through any other means. This is achieved through the school nurses and it is up to their discretion whether this Fund is appropriate to use for their needs. In the past the LRSH has provided funding for the following: eye care, hearing, pharmaceuticals and drugs, dental, physicians, hospital, and travel. Currently there is a \$300 limit per individual per year, however exceptions have been made for extenuating circumstances.

The Myers Health cabinet has recently taken on a supervisory role to this Fund and continues to educate our school nurses about this fund and how to request the monies. School nurses simply submit a request form to our church office and we then give the information to the LRSH treasurer, who pays the bill upon verification of the service provided.

So how can you, the congregation of Myers Memorial, help with this? You can spread the word about this amazing Fund to your friends and neighbors letting them know how Myers serves our local school children. You can encourage friends to make this fund known to others and even contributing to the fund. You can contribute to the fund. Contributions can be made in honor or in memory of a loved one or friend by simply making a check out to Myers Memorial UMC and designate LRSH Fund in the memo.

from the Finance Committee

The Finance Committee has been busy so far this year and set transparency and flexibility as two goals for 2019. Our meetings so far this year have focused on the 2019 budget and various reports related to our finances. One of our areas is internal control. For example, we make sure the offering is counted by both the head usher and a Finance Committee member. You may remember the Pumpkin Patch also had some new procedures for collections last year also. We will share with you over the next few months things like "internal controls" so you have a window in to the various hats our committee wears.

Our 2019 budget is over \$10,000 less than our 2018 budget. March is our first of four five-Sunday months for 2019. To date through March 17 offering, we have collected in excess of \$122,000 in 2019 offerings. On a weekly basis, we are \$13,000+ behind the amount our 2019 budget would expect. Our offerings consist primarily of *Pledged Collections* and *Unpledged Collections*. Our 2019 *Unpledged Collections* are more than usual but pledges can be made any time throughout the year. The committee will continue to monitor the budget closely and we remain alert for any area of savings. So far through February 2019 we have made apportionment payments of \$320. These were designated by the giver(s) specifically for apportionment. Our committee looks forward to serving Myers through out 2019!
