The idea of a Pounding dates back to the age of the original Quakers. The custom was established to welcome a new community leader and family into a community. The idea was to give the family a pound of pantry staples...corn, wheat, sugar, butter, etc. It was a sign of hospitality and welcome.



MYERS COLUMBARIUM UPDATE

Like many things, supply chain issues have continually postponed the building of a columbarium at Myers Memorial UMC. The task force overseeing the project has decided to move forward with good faith that construction can begin in 2023 and are currently awaiting updated architectural plan before applying for necessary permits and proceeding. A columbarium is an architectural structure used to shelter cremation urns. The columbarium will be located in a small grassy area on the side of the CFC building. If you are parked in the small parking lot facing the CFC portico entrance, the grassy area is to the left of that entrance. The columbarium will be initially constructed with 100 niches with room for expansion. Niches are currently priced at \$2,000 for one urn, \$2,500 for two urns. Two urns is the maximum allowed in a niche. The Myers Trustees have been hard at work heading up various projects around the church, including the sale of the Trinity building. The **building's exterior painting has been completed**, more HVAC systems have been replaced, the parking lot paving will be completed as the weather allows, the sanctuary roof will be replaced in November and new electronic signs are being installed along both New Hope Rd and Burtonwood Rd. as the newsletter is printing. One exciting thing of note is that the Trinity Bell has been refurbished and has found a permanent home just outside the Sanctuary doors. Trustees is also updating the security/fire alarm system throughout the church facility and installing

directional signs at key points around the outside of the building. We are grateful for the community grant and the funds from the sale of the Trinity building that have made continual updates to our facility possible.
